



# DOMESTIC VIOLENCE LETHALITY SCREEN FOR FIRST RESPONDERS

**When to Initiate a Lethality Assessment?** When an **intimate relationship** is involved; **AND** You believe an **assault** has occurred, You sense the potential for **danger** is high, Names of parties or location are **repeat** names or locations, **OR** You simply believe one should be done.

<b>▶ A "Yes" response to any of Questions #1-3 automatically triggers the High-Danger referral.</b>		
1. Has he/she ever used a weapon against you or threatened you with a weapon?	Yes	No
2. Has he/she threatened to kill you or your children?	Yes	No
3. Do you think he/she might try to kill you?	Yes	No
<b>▶ Negative responses to Questions #1-3, but positive responses to at least four of Questions #4-11, trigger the High-Danger referral.</b>		
4. Does he/she have a gun or can he/she get one easily?	Yes	No
5. Has he/she ever tried to choke you?	Yes	No
6. Is he/she violently or constantly jealous or does he/she control most of your daily activities?	Yes	No
7. Have you left him/her or separated after living together or being married?	Yes	No
8. Is he/she unemployed?	Yes	No
9. Has he/she ever tried to kill himself/herself?	Yes	No
10. Do you have a child that he/she knows is not his/hers?	Yes	No
11. Does he/she follow or spy on you or leave threatening messages?	Yes	No
<b>▶ An officer may trigger the High-Danger referral, if not already triggered above, as a result of the victim's response to the below question, or whenever the officer believes the victim is in a potentially lethal situation.</b>		
Is there anything else that worries you about your safety? (If "yes") What worries you?

**Note:** The questions above and the criteria for determining the level of risk a person faces is based on the best available research on factors associated with lethal violence by a current or former intimate partner. However, each situation may present unique factors that influence risk for lethal violence that are not captured by this screen. Although most victims who screen "high danger" would not be expected to be killed, these victims face much higher risk than that of other victims of intimate partner violence.
